The Decision - Pedestrian safety for 11-14 year olds

Year 7 & 8 (11 - 12 years)

The Decision focuses on young people and their behaviour on and around roads. The play is set in a courtroom and flashes back to moments in the young peoples lives, eventually leading up to the death of a young boy called Jamie. The Decision quite simply shows us how easy it is to NOT think about what you are doing and demonstrates how dangerous this can be when near roads. Students are asked to vote as a jury to whether the driver is guilty or not guilty.

Key issues: Distraction/Choices/Carelessness

The Swag Bag Gang

Keystage 2 (7 - 11 years)

The Swag Bag Gang clearly demonstrates the dangers when crossing or playing near a road and the consequences of not wearing a seatbelt. Via the medium of theatre, the audience are transported to the scene of a crime where we investigate a series of catastrophic events. With slap stick characters, and an exciting plot. The actors performance is fast, funny and very powerful.

Courtroom

Keystage 2 (7 - 11 years)

Using the audience as jury members and people of the court, the Judge and Lawyers go over the events surrounding a road traffic accident, trying to establish how this kind of accident can be prevented in the future. Courtroom allows the audience to establish their own views on how these accidents can be prevented and stresses the importance of taking personal responsibility, whether by the road or in a car.

New Wheels - Dangerous driving & drug driving

Year 11+ (15-21 Years)

A tragic tale that shows how two brothers are involved in a horrific car crash following a night out. The crash is caused by drugs and dangerous driving. The play demonstrates the consequences of reckless driving which ends in one person dead, one person in a wheel chair and another serving a 10 year jail sentence.

Key issues: Dangerous Driving /Drug Driving/Seatbelts/Driver Distraction
 Duration: 50 minutes . Workshop: 10 minute visualisation and Q&A
 Availability: September - March . Price: £4200 per week of 10 performances



Second Chance - Transition to Secondary School

Year 6-7 (10-11 years)

This is not only a road safety play, Second Chance also deals with a multitude of issues that face young people when they enter Secondary school including making friends; interacting with teachers; bullying and peer pressure and the transition between Primary and Secondary education. Second Chance is targeted at Years 6 and 7 students and aims to both inform and educate them about the dangers of the road. All the issues in the play are dealt with in a humorous yet sensitive manner, gaining the students attention and trust before delivering the more powerful messages.

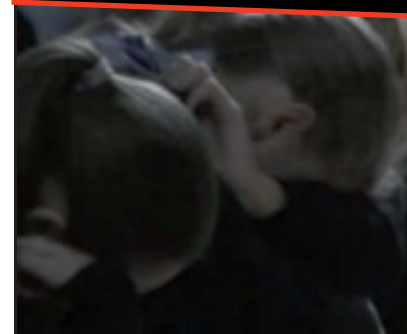
Perfect - Seatbelts & driver distraction for age 14+

Year 9+ (13 years upwards)

Perfect is a tragic comedy that follows the tale of Anne, a 13 year old girl who is severely injured in a car crash and has over three hundred stitches to her face and head. The play shows how a 30mph crash can cause massive trauma to a family and clearly demonstrates how important it is to always wear a seatbelt. A chilling true story with a powerful message.

Duration: 40 minutes . Workshop: Visualisation session involving the whole audience and post performance Q&A . Availability: Throughout the academic year . Price: £4200 per week of 10 performances

Year 8 (12 - 13 year olds)

One Green Bottle shows us how a 12 year old boy deals with every day life and how a simple error can cause devastation. The play shows us a number of scenarios he was involved in, leading up to a tragic accident that leaves him paralysed and unable to speak. Using a powerful sound-scape and popular music One Green Bottle is

funny and highly entertaining. It empowers the audience and makes them understand the importance of road safety.
